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The great arch of Wribbenhall Viaduct which crosses the Kidderminster road. This span is 48 ft 9 inches on the skew and 40 ft on the square. The remaining seven arches are 25 ft span and the whole structure is 112 yds in length. The local sandstone used in the building of this structure has weathered badly and repairs have been carried out in blue brick ever since opening. To the left of this photograph (The north end of the structure) the railway runs on top of a retaining wall. This collapsed during construction, injuring 2 workers
