A view over the town can be seen from platform 1. The row of white houses in front of the church lie on the west bank of the River Severn, which is the parish of Bewdley. All of the houses in the foreground and the station are in the parish of Wribbenhall, so technically the station name is wrong! Both settlements were established by the Saxons and became an important port and crossing place (Though the earliest bridge was built in 1336). The opening of the canal in Stourport wiped out much of the trade however, and the railway was seen as a lifeline to the town.
