Pacific Power Report

On the Charitable Trust's VIP Flying Scotsman day, Wednesday 21st September, we welcomed 1,700 passengers. For the subsequent Pacific Power Days (22nd – 26th September), passenger numbers, including non-FS/Tornado tickets holders, were at 2,547 on the Thursday and rose steadily throughout the event to end at 2,868 on the Monday. The profit from the Charitable Trust event was £80,000. This was made up of £50,000 income after costs, plus £30,000 of on-the-day donations including Gift Aid and match funding from the current Heritage Lottery Fund arrangement.

The five Pacific Power days that followed brought in revenue of £317,846. After costs of £117,638 were deducted this gave a result of £200,208.

Following the event, we held both internal and external debriefs. The main points of the internal debrief are summarised below:

- * The operation of the Railway was well supervised. There were some issues over loco positioning which meant some Tornado/Scotsman passengers were not able to take photos of the locos.
- * We managed to accommodate an extra 75 National Express coach passengers who turned up unexpectedly.
- * Our loco crews and the loco representatives from the SVR, Riley's and the National Railway Museum worked very well together. Passengers were allowed footplate access at the terminus stations when possible.
- * Using on-train radios was helpful during the event.
- * The 'Christmas' passenger loading system was used at Kidderminster and this worked well. Having visible lapel tickets was useful. The barrier system used during Pacific Power will be utilised during the Santa operation.
- * Bewdley reported that the systems and procedures put in place worked very well, but the station was much quieter than at Gala events, with disappointing numbers at the station.
- * Arley reported a good atmosphere with all staff and contractors working well together.
- * Highley station had run very well, as reported by Mel Cook.
- * Bridgnorth reported that the timetable had worked well, although there were some complaints on the Wednesday from people who had turned up and were unable to purchase a ticket on-the-day. Car parking worked well.
- * The specially chosen retail products sold very well, and the revenues for bars, catering and retail were £165,733 (compared to £101,938 for the 2015 Autumn Gala). Rob Nichols reported very good results with the on-train buffets.
- * The event received good support from regional TV, radio and press. Most of the exposure was on the first day, but BBC Hereford & Worcester continued its support throughout the event.

In conclusion, this was a large event to put in to the calendar during a busy year, and everyone's support is very much appreciated. I would like to thank Brian Malyon for chairing both the Gala Committee and the debrief. **Nick Ralls, General Manager**



Bridgnorth Station Development

Progress continues at Bridgnorth despite freezing weather

The Bridgnorth project is now well underway and you can see regular updates on syrlive.com . As Express Points goes to press, Infrastructure Manager Chris Bond sends this report:

At the end of week three, Iris Construction is still pressing ahead with the piling operation despite the sub-zero weather. The pile tally has now reached 20, which means the average is around 10 per week with another 43 to go. The Iris site foreman is pleased with progress so far and indeed with the interest their efforts are generating.

The next step of the job is starting the drainage for the new building. This involves the installation of some new drainage runs to tie in with the existing ones on site, plus the setting up of the drains that will service the new building and which need to be incorporated into the concrete slab.

One addition on site this week has been the arrival of a further container for tool and material storage. Due to the cold weather, Iris have been unable to adorn this container in the same paint as their main cabins.

On a lighter note, the boots of one of the piling machine operators are on display in the site canteen as a reminder of the rain seen during storm Angus. They bear witness to the mud endured on that day of constant rain, which resulted in several of the contractors investing in wellingtons normally used in cold stores to protect from temperatures down to -30 deg C. All this embodies the enthusiasm with which this project is being tackled.

The SVR Charitable Trust has announced the appointment of Kidderminster solicitor Peter Copsey to its Board of Trustees.

Welcoming Peter to the Board of Trustees, Director of Development Shelagh Paterson commended Peter's suitability as a new member: "Peter has an infectious enthusiasm for life, and his background in commercial law will greatly strengthen the experience base of our Board. This is a perfect time for him to join us, as the Charitable Trust expands and plays an increasing important role in securing the long-term future of the Railway. Peter's company mfg Solicitors is one of our key supporters, not only as the main sponsor of our fundraising Race Day in Worcester earlier this year, but also as a leading member of our Corporate Partnership Club." Peter has a wealth of previous charity experience; he's actively involved with six separate Building Preservation Trusts including Hartlebury Castle's. He's looking forward to playing his part at the Railway:

MOTIVE POWER AND CARRIAGE & WAGON UPDATE

What's happening at ESMP?

- * Neil Taylor is cascading the next six months' objectives to the Team Leaders. Critical to future success will be the way in which the whole team takes ownership of their objectives. Objectives will focus on People, Process, Infrastructure and Projects. We would encourage people to drop by and discuss what is being done differently.
- * A new 'Visitors to MPD process' is being implemented and tested.
- * 7714 will return to the operational fleet in time for December working.
- * 75069 will have very increased resources placed on it to accelerate progress.
- * 42968 has been progressed with volunteers, and full time resource will start to increase.
- * In both the above cases we will re-baseline the programme from a cost and schedule point of view within the next three months. These will be the test cases for our improved management plans. They may not be perfect, but they will be better.
- * Hagley Hall's tender will get resources, and work will continue to prepare the frames for the tank.
- * Dunrobin will continue to progress with a single resource allocated.
- * Most boilers now have allocated resource of some number, plus volunteer allocations. We still need to recruit some further resource to approach the correct compliment of boilersmiths.
- * Operational availability will be focused on the assets for December but much effort has been made to assemble and prioritise the multitude of work for winter repairs. What's happening at Carriage & Wagon?
- * Work continues on 4550 in the paint shop, and plans are being prepared for the overhaul of 9369 and 9615.
- * Gresley brake 24068's roof has begun to leak and it has been withdrawn from normal traffic. Additionally, Gresleys 24105 and 43612 are a cause for concern, and a review of their condition will take place after the Santa operation. We may limit their availability to stop them deteriorating any further and requiring a larger amount work.
- * A paper is being written to review the size and make-up of the SVR's carriage fleet to suit the Railway's needs, and a proposal for the GWR buffet/wheelchair conversion is being completed.
- * Following the £75,000 grant from the Department for Transport, we are completing the plan and budget for the conversion of 4399 and 80776 for wheelchair access.
- * Programme for wagon overhauls is being agreed.

INTER RAIL PASS APPLICATION FOR 2017 TRAVEL

Available to All Volunteers and Employees

The SVR, through its membership of the Heritage Railway Association (HRA), once again has the opportunity of purchasing a quantity of Inter-Rail Passes for use by working members, employees and directors of the SVR.

This year each pass will cost £30, and is valid for 1 year. It covers both the working member and one accompanying person. It is valid on the majority of preserved railways and preservation sites throughout the UK. Each pass holder may use the pass on any participating railway as often as they like until 28th February 2018, subject only to certain restrictions (e.g. not on Gala Days, Thomas Days, Dining or Santa trains).

If you would like to purchase a pass then please contact the Ticket Office at Comberton Place, Kidderminster by either calling 01562 757900, option 1 or in person during the opening hours of Monday–Friday 9am till 5pm, where the team will be able to take a card payment (or cash if in person).

The deadline for receipt of application is Monday 6th February 2017. When calling the office please have the following details to hand:

- 1) Name
- 2) Address
- 3) Department you volunteer/work with
- 4) Payment Card Details

(N.B. This does NOT replace the Reciprocal Travel Scheme operated in conjunction with certain other preserved railways.)

2016 Share Offer hits the half million pound milestone

The Railway's Chairman Nick Paul announced on Friday 2nd December that more than £500,000 of shares had already been sold for the latest Share Offer. Welcoming this news just a month after the share launch, he said,

"This is a great start to raising £2.5million in 12 months for the Bridgnorth project 'Building for the Future'. Please help us to spread the word about this exciting and transformational project by informing your friends and relations."

With 40% of the applications coming from new shareholders, it seems there's a growing appeal amongst a wider number of people for heritage rail. General Manager Nick Ralls says,

"We have to attribute much of this to the extensive media support we have received and it has generated an exceptionally high level of enquiries as nostalgia for steam takes hold among new local audiences.

"What is also pleasing is that the total invested so far doesn't necessarily yet reflect the true success of the launch. This is a staged application process whereby telephone and web applicants must first receive, complete and then return an application pack which must itself be carefully processed before the end sales tally can be updated.
